SECTION – A**(READING)**

(1 – 9) : Read the passage given below and answer the questions that follow :

By now Vallabhbhai's life had become wholly a life of a public man, but the movement which earned him the title of Sardar was the movement started in Bardoli in 1928.

In the first phase of the non-cooperation movement, Gandhiji had decided to make Bardoli the centre of his movement, but after the Chauri-Chaura incident he had to suspend this programme. But Government's wrath had already fallen on Bardoli and therefore, when in 1928 a revision of the settlement was done for this area, the revenue demand was raised by 22%.

The cultivators protested against this and a delegation of their representatives met the authorities. But Government was deaf to their plea, nobody even paid attention to what they had to say. A cold reply was given that no interference was possible in a decision taken by the Revenue Department.

So the cultivators turned to Vallabhbhai seeking his guidance. Vallabhbhai went into the matter thoroughly and then spoke to Gandhiji. He told Gandhiji that he had made a very thorough inquiry and he felt it was a proper occasion to take up the cudgels against the authorities. Gandhiji in reply said, "Then I should wish only that victory be with Gujarat."

Sardar had his own ways of testing people. Once he asked a prominent leader and zamindar of the area what his opinion was about this matter. The gentleman replied, “If even four men prove to be men of integrity and determination, the whole taluka will stand by them.” “Would you count yourself among the four.” “No, sir, I am one of those who would follow the four,” came the reply.

Then Vallabhbhai exhorted the people saying, “Let only four such men come forward who are willing to sacrifice their all in a conflict in the cause of justice, in a fight against this unfair increase in revenue”.

In the twinkling of an eye four men sprang to their feet. But Sardar again and again warned people about what would be demanded of them. “I will not stand any nonsense”, he said, “I do not incline towards taking up only such matters an involve no risks to fight a difficult battle. If you falter or if you lose, you will not suffer alone, adversity will be fall all alike, remember that”.

He also talked to the authorities but to no avail. Eventually on February 12, 1928, a resolution was unanimously passed at a meeting of cultivators that a satyagraha movement would be started.

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continue with one's old system of education without examining it to see whether it is in fact suitable or not.

In many modern countries it has for some time been fashionable to think that, by free education for all whether rich or poor, clever or stupid one can solve all the problems of society and build a perfect nation. But we can already see that free education for all is not enough; we find in such countries a far larger number of people with university degrees than there are jobs for them to fill. Because of their degrees, they refuse to do what they think 'low work'; and, infact, work with the hands is thought to be dirty and shameful in such countries.

But we have to think a moment to understand that the work of a completely uneducated farmer is far more important than that of a professor; we can live without education but we die if we have no food. If no one cleaned our streets and took the rubbish away from our houses, we should get terrible diseases in our towns. In countries where there are no servants because everyone is ashamed to do such work, the professors have to waste much of their time doing housework.

In fact, when we say that all of us must be educated, we mean that all of us must be educated in such a way that, firstly, each of us can do whatever job is suited to brain and ability. Secondly that we can realise that all jobs are necessary to society and that it is very bad to be ashamed of one's work, or to scorn the society.
